Strip away everything else, and there are (as far as I'm concerned) only three fundamental states in life. The first is being awake. The second is eating. The third is sleeping.

A simple and uncomplicated philosophy, don't you agree?

If you accept this then, obviously, you only need to stay awake long enough to find food. Having found enough food then you are left with the all-important but often overlooked matter of sleeping. And it is here, at the final but most critical point, that the true value of maximum sleep-quality and sleep-length are all too frequently forgotten in the daily competition to be seen as busy, busier and busiest!

It is to this hitherto neglected subject – the choice of sleeping location – that I shall devote the remainder of this newsletter.


The nests of birds may appear inviting at first glance. They are invariably lined with soft down feathers and are usually placed well beyond the reach of all but the most determined of searches. But be warned. Very few are engineered to be of a size and strength capable of supporting any but the smallest and thinnest of dragons. Of the few I have found initially suitable, difficult climbs, over-crowding, persistent complaints from the rightful owners and excessive rocking back and forth in the wind, all tend to interfere with the pursuit of unbroken slumber. Birds nests are, therefore, generally to be avoided by the discerning dragon.

Drifts of fallen leaves are a readily available and practical alternative offering the combined benefits of insulation and camouflage. However, torrential rain and creeping insects can prove irritating. Leaves are best sought out only after a long period of settled weather and subjected to additional winnowing to dislodge undesirable bugs and suck—like before bedding down.

To the uninitiated, sleeping under water may seem a bizarre choice. Well, perhaps it is, but this only adds to the attraction as far as I'm concerned—who would ever think of looking for a sleeping dragon in such a place! Find a shallow pool that has been warmed to a pleasant temperature by the sun, plug the nostrils with clay, place a hollow reed stem in the mouth to serve as a breathing tube, and lie back. I once slept for so long in such a place that, by the time I awoke, the pool had all but dried up around me! As an added benefit, the cool mud is a wonderful hide conditioner. One word of warning, for obvious reasons this type of location should be avoided by restless sleepers who are prone to rolling over in their sleep.

That's it! I've had enough! I'm off to find a bed of leaves for the rest of the day . . . May all your sleeping be long and undisturbed.






SECOND TIER OF RETIREMENTS

#1041 - Groc, the Troll




#2101-Large N'Chakk
